- Historic Mill Creek A reconstructed, fully operational 18th century waterpowered sawmill nestled in a 625 acre wooded setting. Historical guides present both natural & human history of this, one of Michigan's first industrial sites.



- Colonial Michilimackinac First settled by French soldiers over 275 years ago, this National Historic Landmark now lays claim to thousands of significant finds as the site of the longest on-going archaeological dig in America. Visitors enjoy life at a frontier crossroads with a Native American program, black powder musket firings, a unique underground tunnel featuring the "Treasures From the Sand" exhibit
- Fort Mackinac This National Historic Landmark was restored in the 18th & 19th century with British & American military outposts including 14 original buildings. Abandoned by the military, Fort Mackinac became part of Michigan's first state park in 1895.



- Old Fort Mackinac Lighthouse- A point in the storm and a guiding beacon since 1889, Old Mackinac Point Lighthouse helped passing ships navigate through the treacherous waters of the Straits of Mackinac. There's just as much to see from the top of the tower as inside the original buildings. Authentically restored quarters and exhibits, including the original lens and an audiovisual program, Shipwrecks of the Straits, make this "Castle of the Straits" a true gem of the Great Lakes.
